

MARK TWAIN LAKE JUNE 7- 8

Third Place was won by Terry Stanek and Lori Luzynski. They had 5 fish which weighed in at 10.96 pounds. Brush hogs and buzz baits were the ticket for them.

Big Bass for Saturday was caught by Pam Wakim. It weighed 3.93 pounds and was caught on a crankbait.



Big Bass for Sunday was brought in by Ken Jones. It weighed 5.37 pounds and Ken said he caught it on a Hoodaddy (different version of a brush hog). Ken also won the side pot of \$70.00.
